- Also a big Thank You to PAC for the Dance Play in the last week of January. Ashley Diaz from Penticton put the program on and the kids loved it.
- Basketball is in full swing. Practices on Tuesday 4-5pm. Jeff is talking to administrators next week to see if we can do a couple games (one home, one away?) as a reward
- Will be talking about Track and Field, and X-Country running to start up soon
o Coming up:
- Cross country skiing for Grade 4-5's today and 24th Feb and March 3
- Pro d day and Family day
- Next Wed is Pink Shirt Day (anti bullying), but this year we are going to focus on conflict resolution. We don't have a lot of bullying but the kids all know eachother so well, so learning some more skills on perspective-taking and conflict resolution

- Shamrock Games on March 18
o Outdoor Learning Space: this spring to have the bordering, engineered bark mulch
- Jeff spoke with West Bench as they also have plans for something similar. Needs to see if it is the size might work and then how much fundraising we need to do
o School Goal: focussed on reading this year. Trying to build a culture where reading is really valued by our school. How to create that culture?
- 1: look at resources. Do we have the correct/appropriate with making sure we have enough books of each levels. What are the books kids WANT to read?
- 2: making the school a more reading friendly place. Are there little corners in the school and in the classrooms that are cozy little reading corners? We want to look at our school and see how we can make it more of a reading-friendly space. (Sitting at their desks or library tables isn't very cozy)
o Covid-19: yesterday, Bonnie Henry lifted some restrictions. We are expecting that possibly some restrictions MIGHT be lifted in the next little while. Nothing official has happened yet, but we are thinking it might be coming soon (assemblies, parent volunteers, etc).
o Rapid antigen tests for symptomatic students will start to arrive soon. Rapid tests will soon be sent home with symptomatic students.

o Busy month in January:
- Jan 20th budget committee for determining 2022-2023 budget came together.
- HVAC ventilation: the mechanical engineering firm is currently checking all the systems in the district and will report back soon.
- Ministry is starting to receive shipments of rapid tests for staff and students.
- A child was struck in a crosswalk in front of a school in Penticton. City of Penticton is stepping in to encourage Ministry of Transportation to make amendments to encourage traffic calming. RDOS is being encouraged to step in and do the same for rural schools outside of the Penticton jurisdiction.
- Long-range facility plan is put on hold until later in the school year, until the district can meet with parents directly.

- Miranda Halladay here to present - wearing her NaramataSlow hat. One of the initiatives that NaramataSlow is embarking on, is having Naramata recognized as an official Dark Sky Community. Growth of our community means a lot of light pollution, and protecting our spectacular night sky is paramount.
- Miranda attended an event at Chute Lake Lodge in the fall. A private company
(www.bcplanetarium.com/shows/ brings a portable 'dome' to put on a presentation for the kids on
Earth Day. They could do a showing during the day for the elementary school, and then an evening presentation for the community.
- Question about the facility: the school board offices thinks that we *might* be able to plan for this, particularly since it seems that restrictions might be lessening soon.

- From President (Heather):
