## Reports:

- Administrator- Jeff Redden
o Grade 45 basketball season wrapped up today, pizza party to wrap up the season. We had an in school tournament since inter-school games didn't' happen. Thanks to Miss Aoki and Mr Johnson
- Friday morning is Shamrock Games
o Spring break March 19 - April 3, back to school April 4
- Scholastic Book Fair will happen April 13-14 - parents can come in with their kids before school and after school. Looking for a few parent volunteers to help set up. Ms Kidd would like a few volunteers
- Class photos Wed April 20
o Ready Set Learn for 3 and 4 year olds in the community coming up soon - will do it in person but not as many presenters in the past. WIII keep it quite simple but nice to get kids and parents into the school.
- April 25 Pro D Day
o Thurs April 28 Early Dismissal. THis is usually the "Student Led Conferences" where kids can showcase their work to their parents
o Covid updates:
- Guidelines have changed/are changing
- Face coverings will now be optional after Spring Break
- Changes to space arrangements: Previously we were trying to keep as much space between children; after spring break staff will be able to prioritize configurations for learning and to just be mindful of spacing
- Gatherings permitted at 50\% Capacity, expecting it to become $100 \%$ soon
- Visitors: will go back to pre-Covid (visitors to check in at office, no more sign in sheet at the door)
- School has a number of rapid tests for parents to pick up. A few have been picked up but most are still needing to be picked up. Just call the school and we can arrange for a pick up time.


## Outdoor Learning Centre

- Expecting late spring, early summer for installation
- Jeff reached out to the principal at West Bench, as they have something similar and have a cover that the design has been sent already to the school board. Needs to be a somewhat solid cover (not a shade sail)


## Treasurer- Stephanie Prins

- Current balances:
- Profit/loss: no income
- Expenses: $\$ 3563$ sports equipment, DancePlay, Christmas gingerbread houses; $\$ 600$ on gifts for staff. Currently have $\$ 21,800$
- Gaming Account $\$ 4600$ **need to spend this before the school year end. School bussing and Apex field trips can be applied to this)
- RDOS grant: Heather to follow up on the RDOS grant. We will take the $\$ 7000$ from our own account to purchase what is needed from the RDOS allocation, and once that grant does come in, we can move the money over.

## Old Business

- We have not had any volunteers. :(

- over \$5600 gross sales
- Sold 677 tickets: $\$ 10$ each or 3 for $\$ 25$. Only $13 \%$ chose the 1 ticket. Average transaction was \$38.
- This year: open May 1, close May 31
- They will add some higher priced ticket pricing (ie. a \$50+ bundle)
- Licensing has relaxed a bit so should make it a bit easier to coordinate
