 - o Grade 2-3's been practicing the May Pole (thanks to Val and Yanti) huge thank you to Val! May 6 the kids will be filmed at the park doing their dance.

June:

- Wed June 25th leaving ceremony. They won't get to do a camp-out but we are looking for what we can do and in a safe way.

Updated Covid-19 guidelines: mask requirements for 4-5s. The kids have been AMAZING through all of this. They have to wear them all day except when eating and drinking, and the kids have been really flexible and have rolled with it.

Trauma-informed learning model: schools are a safe place and where they are to feel connected. We know that kids behaviour is telling us things, and we want to focus on the relationships that the kids have (with their peers, teachers, staff).

Jeff shared the results of a survey that they had done at the school to see how the kids are faring at the school. Overall they are very happy, feeling very connected, and have lots of close friends and staff that they feel connected with. Wonderful update!!

Old Business:

- FUNDRAISING:
 - o No parents stepped up to volunteer so we will re-visit the coupon book in the fall.

 - o Update from Jeff: Letter to the RDOS has been sent. Karla replied and said that it is an MOT issue, so the letter has been re-sent to Ministry of Transportation.
- HOT LUNCH PROGRAM:

Still needs a volunteer (or two, or three): we need to break up the job into 3 job descriptions and have a paper copy go home with the kids. Can send out in the next newsletter.

New Business:

- PARENTS SURVEY
 - We need to survey parents, to find out what level of interest there is in PAC events, volunteering, fundraising. As well, some parents would just prefer to make a donation.
