Reports:

- Administrator- Jeff Redden
 - o Thank you to PAC for treat boxes
 - o Jingle was a success. Thank you to all the volunteers, PAC, Yanti etc
 - o Rattlers Gear order did go out before Christmas. Supply chain issues are making it difficult. Should have it all by end of January.
 - o Late French Immersion program deadline is Tues Feb 1 for grade 5 parents
 - Health and Safety Guidelines: reminder to parents about daily health check. Masks are very important, handwashing. Teachers are trying to distance students. Miss Aoki's class is coming in a different door to prevent too many students gathering in one spot.
 - The kids have been really good at stepping up their game. Staff has been asking students to step up again and they have.
 - Vees visit has been cancelled.
 - o Basketball season should be starting up soon. Perhaps February we can have games against other schools.
 - o DancePlay in the gym will be starting soon.
 - o Jan 23-29 is Family Literacy Week.
 - o Cross Country Skiing (Div 1) happening this winter
 - o Pro D Day on the 18th and Family Day on 21st
 - o Report Cards going out in March
 - o Early Dismissal March 10
 - o Shamrock Games March 18
 - o Outdoor Learning Space:
 - Seating has been ordered. Should be installed in the spring.
 - Once the seating is installed, we will get the footings installed for covering.
 - Jeff will talk to PAC to see if we can put the word out locally for someone to design it. A sail shade isn't a good idea as at Giant's Head the kids were playing on it/climbing the poles. We have the funding raised for the seating and footings the shade part will likely be done in a second stage.
 - Jeff has discussed it with Steph already. We discussed that we should send this out to the school community as a whole (not just at PAC meeting) as there is interest from parents to participate.
 - There might be some \$ left from the Stage 1 part of construction.
 - One parent asked if parents can offer skills/time as volunteer resources? We will know this better once we have a design and plan from the district.

- Current balances:
 - \$5476 high interest savings

- \$26,000 main chequing. We have about \$21,000 for our annual expenses, plus our contingency fund.
- \$1500 donations (ticket sales, random donations etc), silent auction \$8500
- Gaming Grand \$1940, \$143 interest revenue

o School board trustee- Kathy Pierre

- Long Range Facility Plan:
 - Quite a few meetings over last few months. Several options have been presented by the contractor. Trustees were not happy with all the suggestions, so at the January 31st School Board Meeting, they'll be putting a motion on the floor regarding the school district plan.
 - A report is submitted to the Ministry of Education as a result of these meetings.
 - Absenteeism is very high, so it is therefore unrealistic that decisions are going to be made on the original timeline. It will be done, but most likely later than originally planned.
 - COVID update: Dr Bonnie Henry continues to make announcements but not putting any mandates in place. It is up to local school districts.
 - 2022-2023 school calendar has been posted for public review, and will be submitted to Ministry by March 31st.
